

A Million Yard Stare

Director's statement

As a father, I've seen the light in a child's eyes—and I've also seen that light dim in the faces of Ukrainian refugee children. This film was born from that gaze. We talk a lot about war in terms of politics, but I wanted to focus on the invisible war: the emotional exile children carry within them.

"A Million Yard Stare" doesn't offer answers. It offers silence, sorrow, and sometimes music — because that's how trauma speaks. The film travels between the violence of a war-torn homeland and the quiet resilience of a child trying to smile again in a foreign place. Through art and movement, this story becomes one of fragile healing.

Germany and Ukraine share the frame, but this story could belong to any child forced from home. I made this film for those who look at refugees with judgment. I want them to see the cost—not in numbers, but in eyes.



Background to the film

"A Million Yard Stare" grew out of a close collaboration between our film team and a local circus club long active in integrating refugee children from war zones.

To keep the film truthful and rooted in real experience, we trained participating children — many of them refugees, including the film's lead actress — for three months both in front of and behind the camera.

More than 100 refugees contributed to the production, bringing their stories, gestures and resilience to the screen.

This is a film made with the people it portrays: intimate, community-driven and quietly political. Above all, it is a testament to how art and human connection can begin to mend the hidden wounds of war.

Logline

A mother longs to see his smile when war robs him of his childhood

Synopsis

When war leaves young Roma numb with the "million yard stare," his mother Oxana fights to heal him. Turning to circus training as a last hope, she embarks on a journey of resilience, love, and healing, striving to bring back Roma's laughter while facing her own buried trauma.

Long Synopsis

After fleeing the war in Ukraine, young Roma and his mother, Oxana, arrive in a foreign country—safe but shattered. Once full of life, Roma has retreated into silence, his gaze fixed in a thousand-yard stare. The distance seems even greater for Roma as if he is a million yards away from the boy he used to be.

Oxana, holding tightly to the hope of seeing her son smile again, pushes aside her grief, focusing all her strength on helping him heal. She takes a leap of faith when a psychologist suggests that the circus—a world once shared with Roma's father— might reach the boy where words cannot.

Amid the swirling colours of the circus world, Roma meets Elias, a boy who carries his own story of loss. The two bond slowly, but the darkness behind Roma's eyes does not lift. When Oxana has a bitter argument with their host, Nicole, Oxana is forced to confront the grief she has long denied.

With the circus show approaching and emotions pushed to the breaking point, Oxana faces one final, desperate question: Can this fragile space of friendship, art, and truth be enough to reach her son, or has the war stolen his smile forever?

In *A Million Yard Stare* (2025), Gautam fuses realism and surrealism to portray a child and mother scarred by war.
